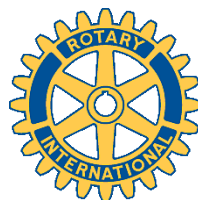

The Big Picture School

Mandy Reynolds-Smith, Principal of Montrose Bay High School could hardly suppress her excitement when talking to the Club about 'the Big Picture School' and its recent move to its new premises at the Goodwood Primary School site. Mandy explained some of the principles on which the Big Picture School is based.

The school is small by design, limited to 120 students, 60 Gr 9s and 60 Gr 10s approx, divided into 6 advisory groups and the students remain in the same group for the 2 years they are part of the Big Picture. The aim is for Relevance, Rigour and Relationships. The learning is personalized with each student developing, with their advisor, a personalized learning plan which has key learning goals but at the same time students are encouraged to develop and pursue their passions. The learning process includes a process of internships where the student spends 2 days per week working in this internship either on campus or in



a working environment so that the learning is real and connected. Assessment is through a process of exhibitions where, each term, the students present their work and in particular their learnings and goal achievements to a group of their advisors, parents and peers. All students enrolled in Big Picture are expected to prepare for College, Polytechnic or an apprenticeship and to graduate from Montrose Bay High School having achieved specific goals.

Jack Eaton explained to members the significance of a Paul Harris Fellow recognition. A Paul Harris Fellow is first and foremost a recognition of a donation of US\$1000 to the Rotary Foundation. It is a way for a Rotary Club to acknowledge members good service but it is not an award. Over 45 years, this club has donated \$48000 to the Rotary Foundation and we have recognized 35 members as Paul Harris Fellows, this includes 13 of our current members. A donation to the Rotary Foundation, the worlds largest private charity, supports Rotary programs such as Group Study Exchange, Youth Exchange, Ambassadorial and Peace Scholars and various Rotary Grants programs



More Indian Road Rules—as experienced by Tony Hennessey:-

6. A vehicle that breaks down on the road must not be moved off the thoroughfare. The vehicle should be surrounded by bricks and repaired on site. If bricks are not available then large rocks are perfectly acceptable.

7. Rocks and bricks should remain on the road after repairs as a long term reminder of the repair

8. Vehicles entering the roadway from the left must not give way and drivers must not check traffic. The appropriate entry is gained by driving at a regular pace onto the road. All vehicles must allow access.
